D. CONSIDER APPROVAL OF ORDINANCE NO. 24-2018: AMENDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2017-2018 ANNUAL BUDGET BY INCREASING GENERAL FUND REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES RESULTING IN A NET DECREASE IN FUND BALANCE OF \$376,670.

City Clerk read Ordinance No. 24-2018 by title only. City Manager Toney-Deal explained that the City incurred costs in the amount of \$376,670 in Fiscal Year 2017-2018 from Hurricane Irma for debris removal, repair of infrastructure, and replacement of equipment. In addition, on July 24, 2018, City Council approved a one-time donation of \$20,943.93 to the St. Petersburg College Foundation to support the construction of the site work for the Civic Building. The \$20, 943.93 is part of the funds that were unanticipated revenues that were returned to the City from a donation to St. Petersburg College Foundation in 2009 for the Natural Habitat Park project.

To date, the City has not received any FEMA reimbursement from federal or state partners. Staff will provide monthly reporting on the progress on FEMA and State reimbursements.
