



PROCLAMATION

WHEREAS, The City of Seminole has been named a Tree City USA by the National Arbor Day Foundation, and this is the seventeenth year Seminole has received this national recognition; and

WHEREAS, in 1872 J. Sterling Morton proposed to the Nebraska Board of Agriculture that a special day be set aside for the planting of trees; and

WHEREAS, this holiday, called Arbor Day, was first observed with the planting of more than a million trees in Nebraska and is now observed throughout the nation and the world; and

WHEREAS, trees can reduce the erosion of our precious topsoil by wind and water, cut heating and cooling costs, moderate the temperature and clean the air, produce life-giving oxygen, and provide habitat for wildlife; and

WHEREAS, trees are a renewable resource giving us paper and wood for our community, and

WHEREAS, trees in our city increase property values, enhance the economic vitality of business areas, beautify our community, and wherever they are planted, are a source of joy and spiritual renewal.


