



The City Council and the City's Emergency Management Team continues to monitor the COVID-19 situation with County, State and National Emergency Management Agencies and continues to carefully assess each day how we can best serve our community and support our employees during these challenging times. This is a "fluid" situation and Seminole City Government is being responsive to changes in regulations, guidelines and community needs.

The following are current changes in City Services:

- All City Buildings are closed to the general public.
- Assistance to our residences and businesses will continue to be offered via telephone and email. City Staff at City Hall, Public Works, Library and Recreation are currently available by telephone to assist you. Please monitor the City of Seminole's website for updates.
- Processes are in place for online permitting and a protocol has been implemented for the drop-off and review of building permits/plans. Building and Code Enforcement Divisions' phones will be staffed during the business day.
- Public Works will continue with projects and will follow established protocols.
- All Fire Department personnel are following the protocols established by the Pinellas County Medical Director. All Fire Department Stations are closed to the Public.
- The Recreation Department and Library are currently developing and/or offering online services. Both the Library and the Recreation Department may be contacted directly by telephone or online to provide our residents with recommended programs and activities. - In accordance with Pinellas County's Stay at Home Order (Resolution #20-20), the City of Seminole will be closing all playgrounds and pavilions in City Parks.
- The Kayak launch in Waterfront Park will remain open.
