

**BUSINESS MEETING MINUTES
SEMINOLE CITY COUNCIL
November 10, 2025**

The Business Meeting of the Seminole City Council was held on Monday, November 10, 2025, at 6:00 p.m., in City Hall, City Council Chambers, 9199 - 113th Street North, Seminole, Florida.

Mayor Waters called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Councilor Al Shields provided the invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

3. ACTION ITEMS

- A. First Reading of Ordinance No. 08-2025: An Ordinance of the City of Seminole, Florida Amending the Budget for Fiscal Year 2025.

City Clerk Mancuso read Ordinance No. 08-2025 by title only.

City Manager Toney-Deal stated that *Florida Statutes* allows Cities sixty-days (60) following the end of the fiscal year to amend the budget. The excess from the Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Agreement and the Fire Protection Service Agreement (FPSA) is rolled into the Pension.

Mayor Waters opened the Public Hearing.

Receiving no request from the public to speak, Mayor Waters closed the Public Hearing.

Discussion ensued.

Motion made by Vice Mayor Burke, seconded by Councilor Springer to approve Ordinance No. 08-2025 on Second and Final Reading.

- B. City of Seminole Proclamation of Emergency for Hurricane Helene Extension No. 59.

City Manager Toney-Deal stated that all authorization paperwork is complete. A schedule of when the work will be completed should be available to Council at the next scheduled meeting.

Motion made by Councilor Shields, seconded by Councilor Beliveau to approve the seven (7) day extension for the Proclamation of Emergency for Hurricane Helene, Extension No. 59 through November 18, 2025.

ALL IN FAVOR, MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.

C. City of Seminole Proclamation of Emergency for Hurricane Milton Extension No. 57.

City Manager Toney-Deal stated that all authorization paperwork is complete. A schedule of when the work will be completed should be available to Council at the next scheduled meeting.

Motion made by Vice Mayor Burke, seconded by Councilor Shields to approve the seven (7) day extension for the Proclamation of Emergency for Hurricane Milton, Extension No. 57 through November 17, 2025.

4. **CITY MANAGER REPORT**

A. Community Policing Report.

Community Policing Officer Deputy Travis Stanton formally introduced himself as the new Community Policing Officer and gave a brief summary of his resume. He advised that he participated in the "Walk to School" with both Orange Grove Elementary and Starkey Elementary students; "Coffee with a Cop" at Starbucks; Fish Fry at the Seminole Historical Society; Music in the Park; Field of Screams; and Florida City Week. He stated that there were no issues at Field of Screams. He will be working the Sail-a-Bratton Waterless Boat Parade in December, and he will be speaking at the Great American Teach In at Starkey Elementary. He also went over the issues that the e-bikes and the emoto bikes are causing.

B. Set Workshop to Interview Recreation Advisory Teen Board Member Applicants.

Motion made by Councilor Barnhorn, seconded by Vice Mayor Burke to set a Workshop to interview the Teen Member applicants for the Recreation Advisory Board on Tuesday, November 18, 2025, at 5:30 p.m.

C. City Manager Toney-Deal gave a brief summary of Florida City Week Activities.

D. City Manager Toney-Deal reminded Councilors that if they would like to attend the Friendsgiving Luncheon with the Seminole Chamber, to RSVP with City Clerk Mancuso.

5. **OLD BUSINESS**

Councilor Beliveau stated that Councilor Shields has joined the Suncoast League of Cities as a voting member.

Councilor Beliveau stated that he attended the memorial service for Fred Jones. Mr. Jones was a member of CERT for many years, was a graduate of the City of Seminole Citizens Academy, and he also served on the City's 50th Anniversary Committee. Councilor Beliveau also announced that the Seminole High School Band is a back-to-back winner in the Class 4A State Championship.

6. **NEW BUSINESS**

Vice Mayor Burke inquired about the Wells Fargo Bank site on Seminole Boulevard which is being torn down; he asked City Manager Toney-Deal if she knew what was planned for that site. City Manager Toney-Deal stated that as of current day, there have been no plans submitted for that property.

Mayor Waters inquired about the AAA building on Seminole Boulevard. City Manager Toney-Deal stated that a contracting business is moving into that building.

Councilor Shields asked to be excused from the October 9, 2025, Special Meeting.


Motion made by Councilor Barnhorn, seconded by Vice Mayor Burke to excuse Councilor Shields from the October 9, 2025, Special Meeting.


ALL IN FAVOR, MOTION PASSED UNANIMOUSLY.
